


MARINE LIFE

This guide is intended to let you know about a few of the many marine species you can see in the waters off Sugar Beach.

The species have been grouped into different types, with an indication of where you can best see them.



SAFETY

Pay particular attention to safe entry and exit points at all times. The safest place to snorkel is in the roped off area within the Marine Reserve (1). This is to the right hand side of the beach. Vessel activity can occur in all other areas.

All of these images were collected while snorkelling at Sugar Beach in 2017. **Common names** are in bold while *Latin* are in italic. An indication of size is given: L = Large, M = Medium, S = Small and VS = Very small. ⊗ = Don't touch, ⊖ = Keep your distance. 1, 2, All, etc. indicates where you can see them. Species are classified as: So = Solitary or in pairs; Sh = shoaling/aggregating; Co = Colonial. Habitats are classified as: Found near/on the reef (Rf); in open water (Ow); on sand (Sa); or Seagrass (Sg). ? = uncertain species.








